The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act which includes a Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).

Midway Paris Beauty School in Ridgewood, Queens, New York has received funding of \$89,208 for assistance to schools accepting Title IV. 50% of this funding is to be distributed directly to eligible students for “expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to Coronavirus.” The following information is reported for the period, October 15,2020 through November 15,2020.

ELIGIBILITY

Here’s what’s required:

Currently attending an approved Title IV degree or certificate program (Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG), Federal Subsidized and Unsubsidized Direct Loans)

Eligible to receive Title IV Aid as determined by FAFSA

Eligible as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid or FAFSA

Maintaining satisfactory academic progress during the time of the school’s closure (Hairdressing & Cosmetology)

U.S. citizenship or eligible noncitizen

A valid Social Security number

Must be enrolled in school as of March 14,2020 thru October 31,2020 and are currently attending school.

According to U.S. Department of Education, only students who are eligible to participate in Federal Title IV programs may receive CARES Act funds.

This is a grant and does not need to be paid back. Students must meet Title IV eligibility requirements to receive HEERF emergency funds. If you require additional information, please contact FA office at midwayparis@verizon.net.

ALLOWABLE EXPENSES

Food expenses may include unexpected grocery expenses or a student supporting dependent children now home due to their school or childcare closure.

Course materials, technology expenses

Health care expenses may include the cost of unanticipated or unusual care expenses due to coronavirus or its effects.

Childcare/Dependent care expenses may include the cost of unanticipated or unusual care expenses for a student's child in the independent (based on FAFSA) student's household.

Total number of students who have received Emergency Financial Aid Grant 45.

Total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students \$ 44,604.

Each student received \$991.20.
