A Note About Placement

During the first few couple of weeks of classes, teachers will evaluate the placement of students. At APSD, student placement is determined first by individual skill levels as assessed by instructors, not by age. Ages and levels that are listed on the schedule are an average of students in the class.

Each student is carefully evaluated and placed in a program best suited to his or her goals and abilities that will provide safe, technically correct training, as well as a challenging, well-rounded appreciation of dance. It is very important to remember that all students are individuals and therefore, are evaluated on an individual basis. Each student has different strengths and they will not all progress at the same rate. The staff at APSD will place students in the most appropriate level to correctly and safely strengthen technique which guarantees a successful learning experience

We are absolutely committed to provide proper training and technique for all of our students. If a student moves on to the next level before they are ready, they are at an increased risk of injury. Most importantly, it is difficult for a student to improve in a class that is too challenging for them. They spend their time trying to remember the pattern of steps or becoming familiar with a step they may not have learned yet, rather than perfect the steps.

We are asking that you please respect the placement decision of the teachers. All of the teachers at APSD are highly qualified, trained and experienced and are placing them according to what they feel is best for your dancer. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to your teacher via email.



APSD COVID-19 Response Plan

APSD has developed a comprehensive COVID-19 response plan. These are temporary measures that we have put in place to keep our students and staff safe. We know things may be somewhat disconcerting to our dancers at first. Please know that our staff is committed to leading with kindness and compassion, while ensuring that our dancers are having fun! To read our full COVID-19 response plan, you can visit our website. Below are some things to keep in mind.

- Masks are required for everyone in the building at all times.
- Due to space limitations, please do not arrive more than 10 minutes early for your class. Dancers must be picked up immediately following class.
- Upon entry, dancers will be subject to temperature checks and will be asked to use hand sanitizer. If a dancer has a temperature above 99.5 degrees, they will be excused from class and will need to schedule a make-up lesson.
- Parents will not be allowed in the lobby. Until further notice, it will be drop off and pick up only. The exception will be dancers age 7 and under and Mommy and Me classes. These dancers may have one parent walk them into the studio. Precious Moments classes may have a parent stay with them for the duration of the class. When classes are finished, a manager will walk the younger dancers outside and wait under the awning.
- Instruction time may end five minutes early in order to begin disinfecting the space.
- Dancers will bring personal items and bags in the classroom and place them in a marked spot. We ask that dancers limit personal items to only those necessary to take class.
- Dancer who are in classes with floor work are asked to bring a yoga mat or towel. This includes strength and stretch, pre-pointe, jazz, hip hop, lyrical, and contemporary.
- We will be cleaning and disinfecting our facility throughout the evening.
