This booklet contains all the information you will need for planning your High Holy Day observance at Beth Israel Congregation in 2019. Please read it carefully before filling in any forms. Keep it handy throughout the Holidays.

INTRODUCTION

L'shana tovah! The high holy days mark the opportunity to gather together and join in the celebration of a new year. They also enable us to work to acknowledge our failings and forgive others as well as ourselves. We are truly blessed to share these holy and sacred days together; we invite each of you to join us to participate in these holy days.

The High Holy Days are a time when many of us attend synagogue services. Each year, we strive to improve upon the High Holy Day experience of the previous year. In addition to our regular services, we will again hold special programming for children who are too young for the full service and a junior congregation for our younger religious school students. We will also provide babysitting for our youngest so that you can enjoy the services while your very young children are well attended. Detailed information is contained in this booklet.

This year, Rabbi Jon Cutler will be leading the services and, again, offer insights into the high holy day service to help us understand and find relevance in this ancient liturgy. On first day Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, our services will be led by our very own Beth Israel Congregation members. The Beth Israel Choir led by Robin Napiecek will take a significant part in our services.

We ask that, whether you are a new or a long-term member, you read this booklet to familiarize yourself with the options for seating, extra seat requests, babysitting, parking, etc.

DUES & SEATING POLICIES

Seating for the High Holy Days is a privilege of membership at Beth Israel. Although worship is open to anyone (without charge) during the year, we cannot extend this privilege during the High Holy Days without doing an injustice to our members. **EVERYONE who plans to attend any service during the high holy days needs to complete a form requesting seats.**

We will again have two different types of seats. General or open seating in the non-reserved section of the sanctuary. The second type will be assigned numbered seat in the reserved section. The first four rows of the pews and all the chairs are open, non-reserved seating. **Only the last four rows of pews are reserved.** If requests for reserved seats exceed the number of seats available, seats will be assigned based on longevity of membership at Beth Israel. **Please be aware that if you request more seats than you had last year, we CANNOT guarantee the same seats as last year.**

For the High Holy Days, we implement additional security precautions for the safety of our congregants and children. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding. Please remember to bring your security fob for easy entry during all services. Please follow the instructions of our ushers. **No tickets will be mailed.** The ushers will check your names from the printed list as you enter services. Please be patient when asked for your name as we are doing our best to provide a safe secure environment for everyone to have a meaningful worship experience. ***To do this, it is extremely important that you return the enclosed form for High Holy Day seats for every person who will be attending High Holy Day services, regardless of the type of seating you wish.*** Requests for seats must be received by **13 September 2019** using the form in this booklet.

As in the past, all members **must** be in good financial standing and have their accounts current for 2019 – 2020 unless special arrangements have been made with the Finance Committee, before seat requests can be honored. If you would like to discuss special arrangements, please contact Stu

Miller, Vice President for Finance (stooley222@yahoo.com), who represents the Finance Committee.

To assign seats efficiently and minimize the number of scattered single seats that cannot be used, the Seating Committee may have to make minor adjustments to seat assignment requests. If changes are made, it will involve shifting a few seats or rows. If you want us to be aware that you wish to sit with other friends or family, please indicate this on the seating request form.

EXTRA SEATS FOR MEMBERS

All dependents of family or single members of the congregation are entitled to High Holy Day seats at no additional charge. Members in good standing may purchase extra seats for the High Holy Days, subject to availability, by completing the seat request form at the back of this booklet. Be sure to indicate how many seats you'll need on the form at the back of the booklet.

Beth Israel participates in an informal reciprocal High Holy Day seat arrangement with other synagogues. Parents or children of our members who are year-round members in good standing at any other congregation that is 60 miles or more from our area may obtain complimentary High Holy Day seats at Beth Israel, if available. Simply send a written request (or fax) from their home congregation to the Beth Israel office specifying the names of the people requesting reciprocal seats. Also, anyone under the age of 30 who graduated from Beth Israel's Religious School may have a High Holy Day ticket for him/herself at no cost. NON-MEMBERS

Non-members may purchase seats at \$250 each. Non-members who join the congregation within the 2019 - 2020 fiscal year will have the cost of their seats applied to their 2019 - 2020 membership dues.

HONORS

High Holy Day honors consist of *aliyot*, ark openings and closings, *hagbahot* (lifting the Torah), and *gelilot* (dressing the Torah). Rabbi Jon and the Ritual Committee have made some changes to services this year to make it more meaningful and enlightening for those in attendance. This has reduced the number of honors available. Traditionally, at Beth Israel, board members and trustees are honored with *aliyot*. We then try to honor those who support the congregation by their

involvement in our religious school, our committees, and our auxiliaries as well as by attending services or other forms of support. In addition, we try to honor families with ark openings and other parts of the service. A separate letter will be sent to those receiving honors specifying the honor offered in recognition of service and contributions to Beth Israel. Please respond to the letter quickly and make sure to arrive as close to the start of services as possible to ensure that you are available for your honor and to help services run smoothly. Often families make a donation to the congregation in appreciation of their recognition and, while this is appreciated, it is not mandatory.

YIZKOR BOOK

The Beth Israel 5780 Yizkor Book provides a way to memorialize your loved ones and contains the names of all those memorialized by Beth Israel families. Reading these names in the Yizkor Book during the service, we can all share our memories as one congregational family.

The Board of Directors suggests a minimum contribution of \$36 for every five names you wish to include in the book. Please send the names you wish included (a form is included at the end of this High Holiday booklet) to the Beth Israel office no later than **Friday, 23 September**. You may indicate that you wish to include the same names as last year and add any names to that list. If no form is received, there will not be an entry for your family, so please be sure to complete and submit the form by the deadline.

BABY SITTING

Babysitting times during the High Holy Day services are listed in the schedule. To help with our planning, please call the Beth Israel office (610-458-8550) to let us know the age of your child (or children) and when you plan to use the baby sitters.

SELICHOT

The month prior to the high holy days, Elul, is the time to prepare. Tradition teaches that Elul is a particularly good time for repentance and this mood builds through the month of Elul to Selichot, Rosh Hashanah, and, finally, Yom Kippur. As the month of Elul draws to a close, the mood of repentance becomes more urgent. Prayers for forgiveness called selichot are added to the daily cycle of religious services and are recited in the early morning, before normal daily shacharit service from the Sunday before Rosh Hashanah until Yom Kippur. (If Rosh Hashanah begins on a Monday or Tuesday, selichot begins on the Sunday of the week before Rosh Hashanah, to make sure that there are at least 3 days of Selichot.) The first selichot service of the holiday season is usually a large community service, held around midnight on the night after the sabbath ends; that is, after nightfall on Saturday. The entire community, including men, women and older children, attend the service, and the rabbi gives a sermon.

We will participate with Keshet Israel in a joint Selichot service this year. Rabbi Jon will lead the program and service at Keshet Israel on Saturday, 21 September, at 8:00 p.m. Plan to begin the high holy day season with our congregations coming together in community.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

For Families with children 8 year olds and younger

We are pleased to offer specially designed programs from 10:30 – 11:30 A.M. for our younger children and their families for the first day of Rosh Hashanah and for Yom Kippur. Children will discover the purpose of each holiday, learn prayers, sing some holiday songs, participate in movement activities, complete a craft, and lastly, have a snack and drink. Rabbi Cutler will also stop in to interact with the children. Please join us! We ask that you please RSVP to the office with the number of children (please mention their ages), and adults who will be attending, so we can properly plan for the correct number of attendees.

For 3rd through 6th grade

Junior Congregation will be held in the chapel on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur from 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. It is an interactive service with the students participating while using Tiku Shofar, the youth machzor from United Synagogue. We hope to have the children join everyone in the sanctuary to hear the blowing of the shofar.

KEVER AVOT (Meditation & Prayer)

Kever Avot (קְבֵר אָבוֹת) means "grave of the fathers" and is the custom of visiting the graves of parents or close relatives and praying there. The prayers ask for peaceful eternal rest and an invocation for God's aid to the living on the basis of the pious deeds of the dead performed in their lifetime. Since, in general, Judaism does not encourage "praying to the dead", the custom of *kever avot* was limited to special occasions; a *yahrzeit*, *erev Rosh Hodesh*, and *Tisha b'Av*.

Our annual *Kever Avot* service at the Beth Israel Cemetery will be held **Sunday, 6 October, at 1:15 p.m.** Following the service, Rabbi Cutler will be available for prayers at individual family gravesites.

SOUNDING OF THE SHOFAR

The shofar will be sounded during services on the first and second days of Rosh Hashanah. It has long been the custom at Beth Israel to have three *ba'al tekiot* (shofar blowers) during these services. Everyone who would like to blow his/her own shofar is invited to come up to the bimah at the end of Yom Kippur. We will signal the end of the service by blowing our shofars together, before the Break-the-Fast.

PARKING

We have allocated additional handicapped parking for the High Holy Days. These are located along the front of the building as well as along the back, near the Memorial Garden. Handicapped parking is very limited so we advise you to come early.

HIGH HOLY DAY FOOD DRIVE

Once again, Beth Israel will be participating in a food drive to benefit local people in need. Your participation is essential to make this effort successful "because no one should go hungry."



Here's how you can help! Donate any unexpired, non-perishable foods such as canned tuna, canned chicken, sardines, pasta, peanut butter, pasta/noodles, jelly, jam, spaghetti sauce, soups, canned fruit, canned vegetables, rice, cereal, baby food, and dried beans. Please bring your donations to Beth Israel Congregation of Chester County between **1 September and 8 October** (there will be a donation box near the front doors of the synagogue.) If you don't have time to shop, feel free to donate a grocery gift card or make a monetary contribution. Every little bit helps.

TZEDAKAH BOXES

Don't forget to bring in your *tzedakah* box during the holiday season. We hope you have saved your loose change during the year in your *tzedakah* box and can now bring it to Beth Israel between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. We'll give you an empty box for next year. The funds collected will go to the charity selected by the congregation at our semi-annual congregational meeting in October. *Tzedakah* boxes will be collected throughout the high holy days.
