October 2017

- 1st** - Poor planting day. Kill poison ivy, weeds, clear land, but no planting.
- 2nd - 3rd** Extra good for vine crops. Favorable days for planting aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 4th - 5th** Extra good for vine crops. Favorable days for planting aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 6th - 7th** Good days for transplanting. Good days for planting beets, carrots, onions, turnips, and other hardy root crops where climate is suitable.
- 8th - 9th** Poor days for planting, seeds tend to rot in ground.
- 10th - 12th** Start seedbeds and flower gardens. Good days for transplanting. Best planting days for fall potatoes, turnips, onions, carrots, beets, and other root crops where climate is suitable.
- 13th - 16th** A most barren period, best for killing plant pests or doing chores around the farm.
- 17th - 18th** Fine for sowing grains, hay, and forage crops. Plant flowers. Favorable days for planting root crops.
- 19th - 21st** Start seedbeds. Favorable days for planting aboveground crops, and leafy vegetables such as lettuce, cabbage, kale, and celery where climate is suitable.
- 22nd - 23rd** Do clearing and plowing, but no planting.
- 24th - 26th** Plant tomatoes, peas, beans, and other aboveground crops, indoors in the North and outdoors in lower South.
- 27th - 28th** Poor planting days. Kill poison ivy, weeds, clear land, but no planting.
- 29th - 31st** Extra good for vine crops. Favorable days for planting aboveground crops where climate is suitable.

Weather

- 1st - 3rd** Fair weather.
- 4th - 7th** Stormy with some wet snow and flurries over the higher-terrain areas.
- 8th - 11th** Mostly fair/cold.
- 12th - 15th** Unsettled followed by clearing skies.
- 16th - 19th** Heavy rain spreads from the Southern Great Plains into the Mississippi River Valley.
- 20th - 23rd** Rain/thunderstorms for Texas and points east, followed by clearing/colder weather.
- 24th - 27th** Fair skies change to unsettled conditions; light rain for Texas and points east.
- 28th - 31st** Increasing cloudiness; very unsettled conditions spread

Acorn Candy Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon prepared chocolate frosting
- 24 milk chocolate candy kisses (such as Hershey's Kisses(R)), unwrapped
- 24 mini vanilla wafer cookies (Nilla(R))
- 24 butterscotch chips

Directions

Smear a small amount of frosting onto the flat bottom of a candy kiss. Press onto the flat bottom of the vanilla wafer. Smear a little more frosting onto the flat bottom of a butterscotch chip, and press onto the rounded top of the cookie. Repeat with remaining ingredients. Set aside to dry, about 30 minutes.
