One of the things we love most about wine is discovering bottles that make you stop and say, "How have I never tried this before?" This month's lineup is full of those moments. From a refreshing Graševina from Croatia to an old-school Venetian Pinot Grigio, alongside outstanding values from Spain, France, and Italy, these wines remind us that some of the world's best bottles are still hiding in plain sight. Whether you're stocking up for late-summer cookouts, patio dinners, or simply looking for your next favorite bottle, this month's collection delivers incredible quality without the premium price tag.

Sparkling, White & Rosé Wines:

#1 – J. Guillermin Brut Blanc de Blancs Cuvée Réserve, NV, Vin de France

Made entirely from white grapes ("Blanc de Blancs"), this French sparkler is bright, elegant, and wonderfully refreshing. Fine bubbles carry flavors of green apple, lemon zest, and a touch of brioche. It's the kind of bottle that makes any occasion feel like a celebration. Perfect with oysters, fried calamari, or Sunday brunch. \$15

#2 – La Berrière Chenin Blanc, 2023, Loire Valley, France

The Loire Valley is Chenin Blanc's spiritual home, and this bottle shows exactly why the grape has earned such a loyal following. Crisp pear, golden apple, and a touch of honeyed citrus give way to a smooth, refreshing finish. Terrific with roast chicken, creamy cheeses, or grilled shrimp. \$14

#3 – Erdutski Vinogradi Graševina, 2025, Croatia - Liter Bottle!!

Croatia may be one of Europe's oldest wine-producing countries, but bottles like this are only now beginning to find their way to American tables. Graševina (known elsewhere as Welschriesling) is Croatia's signature white grape, producing wines that are fresh, lively, and incredibly food-friendly. Look for crisp citrus, ripe apple, and delicate floral notes with a wonderfully clean finish. At a full liter, it's one of the best values on the sheet. Pair with grilled fish, sushi, or anything coming from the garden. \$15

#4 – Terra Musa Pinot Grigio, 2024, Veneto, Italy

Originally crafted for the historic Trattoria Busa alla Torre restaurant in Venice, this is Pinot Grigio the old-fashioned way. A little time on the grape skins gives it a beautiful copper hue, extra texture, and a fascinating hint of raspberry tea alongside orchard fruit and citrus. It's proof that Pinot Grigio can be every bit as interesting as it is refreshing. Outstanding with seafood risotto, roasted chicken, or grilled swordfish. \$14

#5 – Nature et Tradition Sauvignon Blanc, 2023, Bordeaux, France

While Bordeaux may be famous for red wine, it quietly produces some exceptional Sauvignon Blanc. This one combines bright grapefruit, citrus, and white peach with a little extra richness that makes it wonderfully versatile. Try it with goat cheese, shellfish, or fresh summer salads. \$13

#6 – Les Jamelles "Les Petites Jamelles" Rosé, 2025, Languedoc, France

Jean-Claude and Catherine Delaunay created Les Jamelles to showcase the incredible diversity of southern France. This rosé is everything summer should be—fresh strawberry, watermelon, and citrus wrapped in a crisp, refreshing finish. Keep a bottle chilled for picnics, grilled seafood, or an afternoon on the patio. \$12

Red Wines:

#7 – Alain de Treille Pinot Noir, 2024, Vin de France

Silky, smooth, and endlessly drinkable, this French Pinot Noir delivers bright cherry, raspberry, and just a touch of baking spice. It's light enough for salmon and substantial enough for roast chicken or mushroom dishes. A wonderful reminder that great Pinot doesn't have to be expensive. \$14

#8 – Rinaldi Rosso "Fish Red", 2025, Piedmont, Italy

Don't let the name fool you—"Fish Red" isn't a typo! In northern Italy, lighter-bodied reds have traditionally been served with richer fish dishes, and this wine celebrates that heritage. Bright cherry, red plum, and gentle spice make it equally delicious with grilled salmon, tuna, pizza, or pasta. A fun conversation piece that's even better in the glass. \$14

#9 – Bodegas Tempore "Generación 76" Tempranillo, 2022, Rioja, Spain – Was \$24

This may be the steal of the month. Family-owned Bodegas Tempore farms organically in northeastern Spain, producing wines that dramatically outperform their price. Rich blackberry, plum, vanilla, and warm spice come together in a polished Tempranillo with remarkable depth. Originally \$24, it's an unbelievable value at \$16. Pair with grilled steak, roast lamb, or Manchego cheese. \$16

#10 – Viña Galana Garnacha Tintorera, 2022, La Mancha, Spain

Unlike most red grapes, Garnacha Tintorera has naturally red flesh, giving the wine its deep color and generous personality. Ripe blackberry, blueberry, and subtle spice make this a rich yet approachable red that's perfect for barbecue, burgers, or slow-roasted meats. \$15

#11 – Fuentesecca Bobal / Cabernet Sauvignon, 2024, Valencia, Spain

This organic blend combines Spain's native Bobal grape with Cabernet Sauvignon for the best of both worlds. Juicy dark berries, plum, and a hint of spice are supported by a smooth, easygoing finish. A terrific all-purpose red for pizza night, grilled sausages, or backyard cookouts. \$14

#12 – Dante Cabernet Sauvignon, 2023, California

Back by popular demand, Dante continues to deliver classic California Cabernet at an everyday price. Blackberry, cassis, and a touch of cocoa lead into a smooth, satisfying finish. Whether you're firing up burgers or enjoying a quiet evening at home, this Cab is always a welcome guest at the table. \$14
