Sparkling, White & Rosé Wines:

#1 – Milenrama Blanco, 2024, Rioja, Spain

A crisp, unoaked white from Rioja that shows the lighter side of Spain. Expect fresh citrus, green apple, and a touch of herbal lift. Clean and refreshing, it's the kind of white that loves seafood tapas, simple pastas, or just a sunny afternoon. \$14

#2 – Château Cantelaudette Graves Blanc, 2022, Bordeaux, France

From Bordeaux's Graves region, this classic Sauvignon Blanc/Sémillon blend is all about elegance. Bright citrus and grapefruit meet a subtle roundness from the Sémillon. It's zippy yet smooth, perfect with goat cheese salads, roast chicken, or shellfish. \$15

#3 – La Garenne Chenin Blanc, 2024, Loire Valley, France

Chenin Blanc is a chameleon grape, and here it shows off its crisp, mineral-driven side. Notes of pear, quince, and honeyed citrus glide into a clean, refreshing finish. Pair with pork chops, creamy cheeses, or spicy Asian dishes. \$15

#4 – McManis Viognier, 2024, River Junction, California

Viognier is known for its perfumed, exotic character, and McManis nails it. Aromas of peach, apricot, and orange blossom jump from the glass, with a plush, round texture on the palate. Delicious with Thai curry, roast poultry, or even spicy BBQ. \$12

#5 – Haywater Cove Chardonnay, North Fork, Long Island, New York

A sleek, cool-climate Chardonnay from the tip of Long Island. Leaner and fresher in style, with citrus, green apple, and a whisper of sea breeze minerality. Think oysters, clam chowder, or lobster rolls — it's seaside Chardonnay through and through. \$14

#6 – Raza Vinho Verde Rosé, 2024, Minho, Portugal

This lightly fizzy rosé is pure fun in a bottle. Bursting with strawberry, raspberry, and watermelon notes, it's dry, crisp, and super refreshing. Low alcohol makes it easy to drink, and it's a winner with picnic spreads, sushi, or tacos. \$12

Red Wines:

#7 – Carmel Road Pinot Noir, 2023, Monterey, California

Monterey's cool climate gives this Pinot Noir its bright, silky style. Cherry, cranberry, and subtle spice notes flow with a smooth finish. Versatile enough for salmon, chicken, or mushroom flatbreads. Elegant but easygoing. \$13

#8 – Falesco Vitiano, 2021, Umbria, Italy

A classic Italian value blend of Sangiovese, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Merlot. Juicy red berries, dark fruit, and a hint of spice make it lively and approachable. Great with pizza, pasta, or a casual weeknight dinner. \$12

#9 – Revolution Malbec, 2024, Mendoza, Argentina

Bold, dark, and fruit-packed — this is classic Argentine Malbec. Blackberry and plum flavors with a little cocoa and spice on the finish. Great with steak, empanadas, or anything grilled. A real bang-for-the-buck red. \$13

#10 – Comoloco Monastrell, 2022, Jumilla, Spain

From Spain's sun-drenched southeast, this Monastrell (aka Mourvèdre) is plush and ripe with loads of blackberry, blueberry, and spice. Full-bodied but smooth, it pairs beautifully with BBQ ribs, hearty stews, or spicy sausages. \$12

#11 – Rubus Old Vine Zinfandel, 2021, Lodi, California

Zinfandel thrives in Lodi, and these old vines deliver depth and richness. Jammy blackberry and raspberry fruit, hints of pepper, and a touch of mocha on the finish. Big, bold, and perfect with burgers, pizza, or brisket. \$14

#12 – Château Fontanès "Les Traverses" Cabernet Sauvignon, 2022, Languedoc, France

This French Cab shows a more elegant, Old World style compared to California. Blackcurrant and plum fruit mingle with herbal, earthy notes and fine tannins. Structured enough for roast lamb or beef, but still approachable for everyday drinking. \$15
