Field Trip or In School Farm Experience Tours & Special Events for Family, Clubs, Civic Groups, Business, Schools & more! Plan your event with FGF!

Option I: Field Trip to FGF Campus For groups from 45 to 100

Students will break into groups and visit up to 9 Stations to learn about

- 1. Vermicomposting: Worms Making Soil; dig for worms & learn how they make soil
- 2. Edible Landscaping & Rain Retention: Actions people can do at home to grow food in a small space and watering system
- **3.** Plant a starter vegetable plant or seed to take home to start a garden.
- **4.** Green House Propagation & Compost Tea Brewing (Organic Fertilizer)
- **5.** Compost: Making soil from our food scraps & animal dung
- 6. Produce: Organic growing, storage, preparing for market and a taste test of raw veggies.
- 7. Egg Laying Chickens: Learn about chicken feed, care & backyard chickens.
- **8.** Dwarf Nigeria Dairy Goats, Babydoll Southdown Sheep & Horses. Learn about farm animal care
- 9. Beneficial Insects: Honey Bee Hive, Native Bee Hotel, Attract Good Insects with Plants & the Orchard

Option II: In School Farm Experience Min- 20 students Max- 120 Students

We can accommodate 60 students an hour per group and two groups

FGF farmers bring part of our farm to your school or facility with up to 5 stations. Examples are:

- 1. Nigerian Dwarf Dairy Goats
- 2. Chickens
- 3. Vermicomposting (Worms) learn how worms make soil?
- **4.** Planting station to involve the students in planting a seed or plant in a pot to take home
- 5. Vegetable appreciation & Identification station with coloring and craft activities

Option III: Private Farm Tours No Minimum Number of Persons

Option for a family, home school groups, clubs, nonprofits, businesses and other interested groups.

6 to 9 stations are set up and the group is given a tour through the stations.
