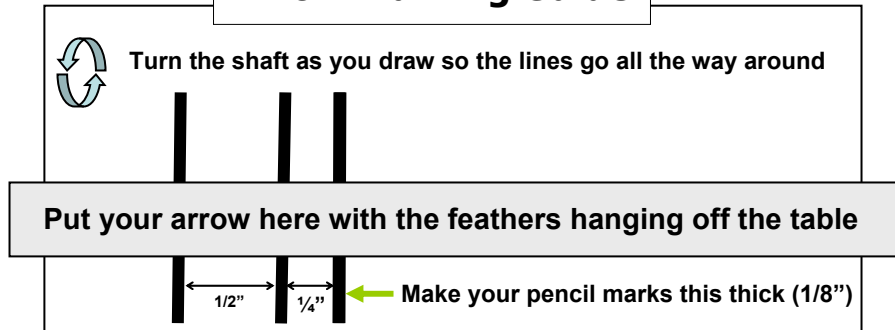

### Steps for painting your Arrow of Honor

1. Fill in the '#' column in the Color Code Chart above with the number you have of each Rank or Award. For example, "1" if you were a Tiger and "1" if you were a Bobcat. Only Silver Arrow Points and Webelos Activity Pins can be more than "1".
2. Starting about 1/2" from the arrowhead sinew, use a pencil and the Arrow Marking Guide below to mark all your ranks and awards. Circle the entire shaft with your pencil marks.
3. Paint between each of the pencil marks – Leave a little bit of the pencil mark unpainted.
4. When the paint is dry, wrap the Graphic Art Tape around the arrow shaft over each pencil mark.

*\*2018 update: Using the new awards system? For Bear: After the Green Stripe, use a one white stripe for each two Adventures above the required 7 Adventures (6 possible). For Webelos and Arrow of Light: After the Blue Stripe, use one white stripe for each Adventure above the required 14 total Webelos and Arrow of Light Adventures (13 possible stripes).*
