Lisner-Louise-Dickson-Hurt Home Reopens Assisted Living Program Following Major Renovation

Washington, D.C. - The Lisner-Louise-Dickson-Hurt Home (LLDH Home), a nonprofit leader in compassionate, person-centered care for District seniors, is proud to announce the reopening of its Assisted Living Residence following a transformative renovation.

Significantly reduced in capacity since 2020 due to a devastating internal flood during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the program now returns with 45 modernized units - 36 newly built and 9 fully renovated - offering safe, accessible, and welcoming homes for seniors with low and modest incomes. This milestone was made possible through the \$20 million Securing Tomorrow campaign, funded by the generosity of donors and partners whose commitment ensures that high-quality, affordable care will remain available to D.C. seniors for generations to come.

The reopening restores a vital service in Ward 3 and reaffirms the Home's commitment to equity, inclusion, and dignity in aging. As one of the only nonprofit assisted living providers in the area, the LLDH Home ensures that seniors - regardless of income - have access to high-quality housing, healthcare, and community.

The Assisted Living Program offers private accommodations, supportive services, and engaging activities that promote independence while meeting residents' evolving needs. Its reopening strengthens the continuum of care on the Home's historic campus and in the surrounding community.

Just steps away, The Louise on Western - a new affordable senior housing community - welcomes residents aged 62 and older earning 30–50% of the Area Median Income. Developed by Urban Atlantic, in partnership with the LLDH Home, and rooted in the mission of the original Louise Home, it is the first project of its kind in Ward 3, expanding access to affordable, high-quality housing for D.C.'s aging population.

Founded in 1939 through the generosity of Abraham and Laura Lisner, the Home's legacy has grown through partnerships with other historic institutions dedicated to elder care, including The Louise Home, The John Dickson Home, The Henry and Annie Hurt Home for the Blind, and The Shoemaker Home. Each retains its unique identity and endowment while working together under the LLDH Home's mission: to provide extraordinary health and life care services to seniors with low and modest incomes in the District of Columbia, empowering them to age with dignity, purpose, and community.
