Contact Lens Fitting Policy

It is the intention of our office to fit you into the best contact lenses for your needs as well as your ocular health. Before you can be fit for contact lenses, a complete medical and refractive examination is necessary once a year. This exam is critical to assure the good health of your eyes and to rule out the possibility of any unsuspected or underlying condition that may prevent contact lens use. If it is determined you are a candidate for contacts, the complete eye exam will help us select the most appropriate lens material and design.

Contact lens patients are charged contact lens fitting fees every year (in addition to regular co-pays). These fees cover the additional time and supplies required to fit and maintain a healthy corneal-contact lens relationship. **Even if you currently wear contacts** it is important to evaluate the fit of the lens on your eye to ensure good ocular health. Please remember that contact lenses are medical devices that when not used properly can cause irreparable damage to the eye and in some cases, permanent vision loss.

For first time contact lens wearers: We will instruct you on the proper insertion and removal techniques as well as cleaning regimen appropriate for the style of lens you are fit with. You are welcome to return to our office as many times as necessary to master this skill. However, we will not permit you to leave the office with the contact lenses until we are assured you can safely handle the lenses.

Often follow-up visits will be scheduled when trying a new prescription or a new brand of lenses. This is to ensure that not only are the lenses fitting properly but that you are happy with the lens performance as well before purchasing a supply. Contact lens prescriptions will not be finalized until the necessary follow-ups are performed.

Contact lens fitting fees are non-refundable.
