Whether you're stocking up for summer cookouts, beach weekends, or simply looking for a few bottles that overdeliver for the price, this month's lineup is loaded with value. From crisp Albariño and Austrian rosé to Rhône reds and Paso Robles Cabernet, these wines prove you don't have to spend a fortune to drink well.

Sparkling, White & Rosé Wines:

#1 – Casillero del Diablo "Devil's Brut", NV, Limarí Valley, Chile

One of Chile's most famous wine brands, Casillero del Diablo traces its name to a legend that the winery's founder spread rumors of the Devil guarding his cellar to keep thieves away. This sparkling wine, made from Chardonnay & Pinot Noir, is bright and refreshing, with notes of green apple, citrus, and white peach carried by lively bubbles. A perfect way to start a party or pair with appetizers, fried seafood, or brunch. \$13

#2 – FAAA Albariño, 2025, Uruguay

Uruguay may be famous for Tannat, but Albariño has quietly become one of the country's most exciting white wines. This vibrant example bursts with citrus, peach, and tropical fruit, balanced by a fresh ocean-breeze character that reflects its Atlantic coastline origins. Fantastic with oysters, shrimp, ceviche, or anything that swims. \$16

#3 – Côté Mas Sauvignon Blanc / Vermentino, 2024, Languedoc, France

Jean-Claude Mas has built a reputation for producing some of southern France's greatest values, and this blend is a perfect example. Sauvignon Blanc brings bright citrus and freshness while Vermentino contributes texture and ripe orchard fruit. The result is lively, flavorful, and incredibly versatile. Try it with grilled fish, salads, or goat cheese. \$14

#4 – The Long Little Dog White, 2023, Vin de France

A charming French Cotes-du-Rhone Blanc that's all about easy enjoyment. It's a blend of Grenache Blanc, Marsanne, Roussanne, Vermentino and Viognier. Fresh notes of citrus, pear, and white flowers lead to a smooth, refreshing finish. The playful label matches the wine inside—friendly, approachable, and ready for any occasion. Great with light appetizers, seafood, or sunny afternoons. \$12

#5 – Salmon Creek Chardonnay, 2024, California

Finding a solid California Chardonnay under ten dollars feels almost impossible these days, which makes this bottle such a pleasant surprise. Ripe apple, pear, and hints of vanilla create a smooth, crowd-pleasing style that's easy to enjoy. A natural companion for roast chicken, creamy pasta dishes, or casual weeknight dinners. \$9

#6 – Paul Direder Rosé, 2025, Wagram, Austria

Paul Direder represents the new generation of Austrian winemakers, farming his family's vineyards with a focus on sustainability and value. This rosé is packed with fresh strawberry, raspberry, and watermelon notes, with remarkable depth and freshness for the price. Serve it with grilled chicken, seafood, picnic fare, or simply enjoy it on the patio. \$16 / Liter Bottle!!

Red Wines:

#7 – Craftwork Pinot Noir, 2023, Monterey, California

Monterey's cool Pacific influence helps create Pinot Noir with vibrant fruit and wonderful balance. This wine offers layers of cherry, raspberry, and subtle baking spice wrapped in a silky texture. Easy to love and incredibly food-friendly, it's terrific with salmon, roast chicken, or mushroom dishes. \$15

#8 – Bodegas Albero "Garnachill", 2025, Castilla-La Mancha, Spain

The name tells you everything you need to know—this is Garnacha meant for pure enjoyment. Bright red berry fruit, hints of spice, and a juicy, approachable personality make this a bottle you'll want to pour generously. Slightly chilled on a warm evening? Even better. Great with burgers, pizza, tacos, or charcuterie. \$16

#9 – Paul Jaboulet "Parallèle 45" Côtes du Rhône, 2021, Rhône Valley, France

Named for the 45th parallel that runs near the winery, Parallèle 45 has been one of France's benchmark values for decades. Grenache and Syrah combine to deliver dark berry fruit, peppery spice, and classic Rhône character. Smooth, balanced, and versatile enough for everything from grilled meats to hearty stews. \$13

#10 – Biagio Sangiovese Cabernet Sauvignon, 2021, Tuscany, Italy

A marriage of Italian tradition and international flair. Sangiovese contributes bright cherry fruit and food-friendly charm, while Cabernet Sauvignon adds depth and structure. The result is a smooth, flavorful red that shines alongside pizza, pasta, grilled pork, or roast beef. \$15

#11 – Bodegas Yllera "Nuevemeses" Tempranillo, 2022, Madrid, Spain

"Nuevemeses" means "nine months," a reference to the wine's aging before release. Bodegas Yllera has been crafting wines in Spain for generations, and this bottle shows why they're so respected. Rich blackberry and plum flavors mingle with hints of spice and vanilla, creating a polished red that's perfect for grilled meats or slow-cooked dishes. \$15

#12 – McPrice Myers "Bull By the Horns" Cabernet Sauvignon, 2022, Paso Robles, California

McPrice Myers has become one of Paso Robles' most celebrated winemakers, known for producing bold, expressive wines that outperform their price tags. Bull By the Horns is loaded with blackberry, cassis, cocoa, and spice, all wrapped in a rich, velvety texture. At \$16, this may be one of the steals of the entire sheet.
