The good news? The mission hasn't changed—these are still wines that *seriously* overdeliver for the price.

Sparkling, White & Rosé Wines:

#1 – Fossi Extra Dry, 2025, Veneto, Italy

A lively Italian sparkler that's all about easy enjoyment. Made predominantly from Glera, the Prosecco grape. Soft bubbles carry notes of pear, green apple, and a hint of citrus, with a clean, refreshing finish. Perfect for brunch, aperitivo hour, or raising a glass just because. \$14

#2 – Tiroliro Vinho Verde, 2024, Minho, Portugal

Light, crisp, and just a touch spritzy, this Portuguese favorite is made for warm days. Lime, green apple, and a hint of tropical fruit keep things fresh and vibrant. Great with seafood, salads, or sipping on the patio. \$14

#3 – Alvarez de Toledo Verdejo / Godello, 2024, Castilla y León, Spain

A fantastic blend of two of Spain's standout white grapes. Bright citrus and orchard fruit from Verdejo meet the rounder, richer texture of Godello. Smooth, balanced, and super food-friendly—think grilled fish, chicken, or veggie dishes. \$13

#4 – Tapestry Sauvignon Blanc, 2023, California

A California take on a classic style, with citrus, melon, and a touch of tropical fruit. It's bright and refreshing with a smooth, easy finish. A great match for goat cheese, shrimp, or anything with fresh herbs. \$14

#5 – Wild Hills Pinot Gris, 2024, Willamette Valley, Oregon

Cool-climate Pinot Gris with a little extra polish. Juicy pear, apple, and subtle citrus notes come together with a smooth, rounded texture. Elegant yet approachable—perfect for salmon, roast chicken, or creamy pastas. \$16

#6 – Fuentesecca Bobal / Cabernet Sauvignon Rosé, 2025, Valencia, Spain

A rosé with a bit more personality, blending native Bobal with Cabernet Sauvignon. Bright strawberry and raspberry notes meet a crisp, refreshing finish. Great for picnics, tapas, or anything off the grill. \$14

Red Wines:

#7 – J. de Villebois Pinot Noir, 2023, Vin de France

From a Loire Valley specialist, this Pinot is silky, fresh, and beautifully balanced. Red cherry, raspberry, and a gentle spice note make it super versatile. Try it with salmon, roast chicken, or mushroom dishes. \$15

#8 – Bodegas Tempore “73” Garnacha, 2022, Rioja, Spain Was - \$24

From a family-run winery focused on sustainable farming, this Garnacha is juicy and expressive. Ripe red berries, a touch of spice, and a smooth finish make it easy to love. Perfect for grilled meats, tapas, or casual dinners. \$16

#9 – Bila Haut Côtes du Roussillon Villages, 2023, Roussillon, France

Crafted by the Chapoutier team, this southern French blend delivers depth and richness. Dark berry fruit, hints of spice, and a smooth, polished finish. A great partner for roasted meats, stews, or anything hearty. \$16

#10 – Areo Malbec, 2024, Patagonia, Argentina

From Argentina’s cooler southern region, this Malbec shows bright, juicy blackberry and plum with a smooth, balanced finish. Bold yet approachable—ideal for steak, burgers, or grilled vegetables. \$15

#11 – McManis Merlot, 2024, River Junction, California

A longtime favorite for a reason. Plush and fruit-forward with notes of plum, cherry, and a touch of vanilla. Smooth, easygoing, and perfect for weeknight dinners, from pasta to meatloaf. \$13

#12 – Nauti Boi Cabernet Sauvignon, 2024, Vin de France

A fun, full-flavored Cab with dark berry fruit, a hint of spice, and a round, satisfying finish. Bold enough for burgers and BBQ, but smooth enough to enjoy on its own. A great everyday red with a little attitude. \$15
