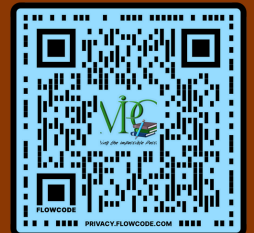

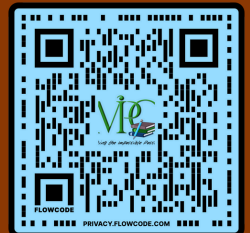

International Program – Tutoring and Homework Help

At MIPO, we believe that true progress happens when we learn, grow, and succeed together. For over two years, our tutoring and homework help service has provided a dedicated, supportive space where elementary and middle school students receive personalized academic guidance. This program helps children understand their lessons, complete assignments, prepare for assessments, and build lasting confidence—all within a calm, structured environment.

During the 2024–2025 school year, we welcomed students from grades 1 through 8 into the program. Each child began with an individualized plan and a shared commitment to growth, supported by a consistent schedule and close communication with their families. Regular progress reports and tailored strategies ensured every student could advance at their own pace, with the full support of our team—including guidance from MIPO's President, Ms. Felina Backer, when needed.

Parents have shared that the program has transformed their “afternoon routines”—homework is no longer a source of stress, and children return home with work completed and understood.

Beyond academics, we've focused on nurturing responsibility, organization, and positive social habits, helping students thrive both in and out of the classroom.

The impact is clear: students show marked improvement in discipline, personal development, and academic performance. They gain independence, confidence, and a supportive peer environment. Parents benefit from reduced stress, saved time, and the assurance that their children are progressing under professional, caring supervision.

We extend our sincere gratitude to MIPO, Inc. for making this initiative possible—and to the families, schools, and community that have embraced it. After more than two years serving the Northeast Department, we are excited to announce that we have extended the Homework Help Service to the children of the North Department in Cap-Haïtien this school year, 2025–2026.

Greta R. Strong, EdD., MPA, MSc., HS-BCP

Dr. Greta Strong, MIPO's esteemed advisor, is truly a treasure to our organization. As a former honoree, she exemplifies the qualities that honorees should embody. Upon learning about MIPO's mission, she felt empowered to sustain, support, and contribute not just financially, but also with every resource at her disposal to ensure we effectively serve those in the U.S. and abroad. She serves as an inspiring role model and a great source of motivation.

From the moment she was invited to join us, Dr. Strong has been the backbone of our organization. Her unwavering determination for MIPO's success is unmatched.

To help you get acquainted with Dr. Strong, she is an Assistant Professor of Community Outreach Teaching in the Department of Neurology at Weill Cornell Medical College, part of Cornell University. She also serves on the Weill Cornell Dean's Community Advisory Board. Additionally, she holds the position of Adjunct Professor at the Metropolitan College of New York and chairs the Dissertation Committee for the Doctor of Education program at St. John Fisher University.

Dr. Strong is involved with various boards and committees, most notably with the Vitiligo Bond Foundation, Inc., a non-profit and coalition member of the National Institutes of Health/National Institutes of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases, which supports individuals living with Vitiligo. She served as a board member of a community-academic partnership that includes scientists from SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University, focusing on public health, medical informatics, and the development of innovative, community-centered solutions for stroke care. Furthermore, she is a board member of Ajalon International Charity, which provides philanthropic support to twenty college students in Ibadan, Oyo State, Nigeria, among other grassroots organizations dedicated to the health and welfare of women and children in underserved communities worldwide.

Dr. Strong has co-chaired the Women's Roundtable Action

Platform of Trinidad and Tobago, fostering connections and empowerment among dynamic women through mentorship, education, and training.

For her commitment to educating and enriching communities both locally and internationally, she has received numerous honors, including proclamations, congressional recognition, and official citations from the New York State Senate, elected officials, and community leaders. Her accolades include the prestigious 2023 U.S. Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award, the National Medal of Honor for Inspiring Initiative from The September 12th Guild, the inaugural Global Citizen Award from 100 Black Men of New York, Inc., the National Council of Negro Women's Executive Leadership Award, the MIPO Award for Outstanding Citizenship Hall of Fame, the Weill Cornell Medicine Pioneers in Diversity Award, the Metropolitan College of New York Crystal Award, and the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. School of Education Award for Exemplary Performance in Leadership from St. John Fisher University, as well as the Leadership and Service Award from the Haitian-American Business Network Chamber of Commerce. She also received the MCNY Power of Purpose Social Impact Award.

Dr. Strong attributes her passion for making an impact to her family's longstanding tradition of providing exceptional service to the communities "where they place their feet." She believes in transformational leadership over transactional leadership, making it easy for her to work pro bono or with non-profits, as they are the foundation of our society.

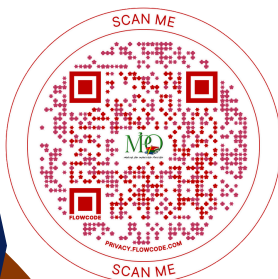

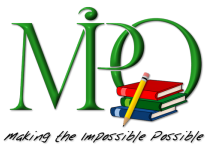
