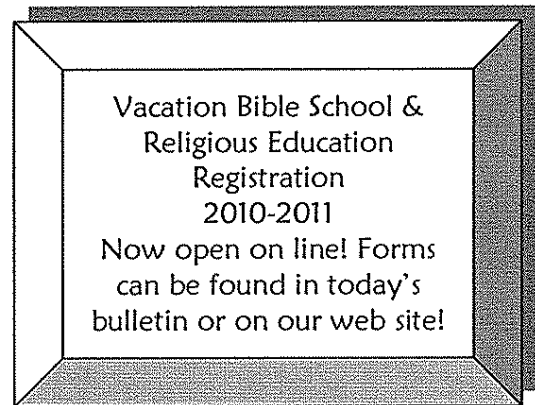

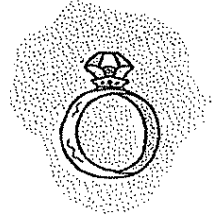

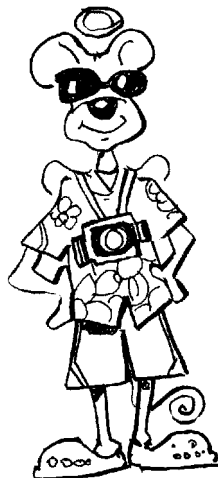


#### Too busy?

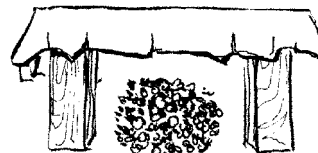

### Why Do Catholics Do That?

### Why is the altar special in our churches?

In the early Church, the altar came to symbolize Christ himself since it is the site of his sacrifice in the Mass. Relics of martyrs used to be placed and sometimes still are placed in the altar so that the Mass is



dedicated to them. This is the altar, a special place in the church where the priest has a special relationship to the altar through his connection with Christ. He celebrates the Mass with us on the altar.



### Fill children's faith toolbox

It can be hard to raise children in a world of friendship in a world that doesn't know. Our best strategy is to give your children the tools they can use to stay close to him and pray they use them as adults.

**Tool 1 - Love** Children first learn about God's love from their families. We must act out of love, teach love, and model love so that children learn to love.

**Tool 2 - Prayer** In prayer, God counsels us, teaches us, comforts us,

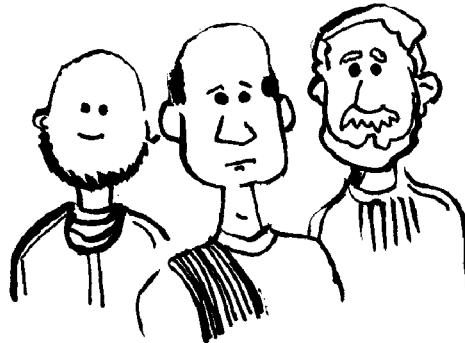

### Luke 9:51-62, What does it take to be a disciple?

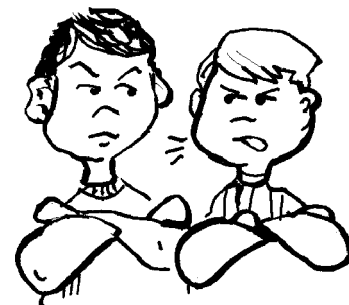

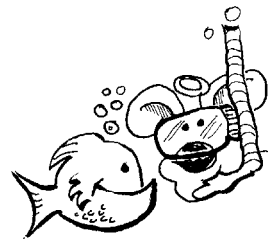
