

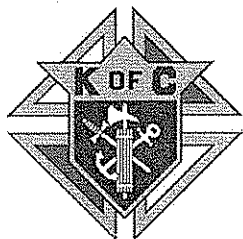

Summer means spending time outdoors and risking injury in the name of fun. If you are a pool worshiper, teach children proper pool safety and etiquette to avoid potential injuries from running, horseplay, or drowning. Dehydration can cause heat-related injuries and poorly prepared bodies can cause muscle and joint injuries.
