Tenebrae Service

March 26, 8:00pm in the Church

The word "tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." Tenebrae is a public singing of Matins (a night office) and Lauds (a morning office) part of the old form of Liturgy of the Hours. The tone of the liturgy is one of mourning and a ceremony of light. A triangular candle stand with thirteen candles is used. In the service itself are scriptural readings and musical settings on the Passion and Death of Our lord Jesus Christ. After each reading and musical setting, these candles are extinguished one by one. After the last candle is extinguished, a prayer is offered in darkness and one candle is re-lit. The assembly is asked to leave in SILENCE. All are welcome to come and participate in this beautiful service. Tenebrae will spiritually prepare you for the holiest season of the Liturgical Year.

Let us now learn the meaning of these ceremonies. The glory of the Son of God was obscured and, so to say, eclipsed by the ignominies He endured during His Passion. He, the Light of the world, powerful in word and work, Who but a few days ago was proclaimed King by the citizens of Jerusalem, is now robbed of all his honors. He is, says Isaias, the man of Sorrows, a leper (Isaias 53:3,4). He is, says the royal prophet, a worm of the earth, and no man (Psalm 21:7). He is, as He says of himself, an object of shame even to his own disciples, for they are all scandalized in him (Mark 14:27) and abandon Him; even Peter protests that he never knew Him. This desertion on the part of His apostles and disciples is expressed by the candles being extinguished, one after the other. Jesus, our Light, though despised and hidden, is not extinguished. This is signified by the candle which is momentarily placed on the altar; it symbolizes our Redeemer suffering and dying on Calvary. In order to express His burial, the candle is hidden behind the altar; its light disappears. A confused noise is heard in the house of God, where all is now darkness. This noise and gloom express the convulsions of nature when Jesus expired on the cross: the earth shook, the rocks were split, and the dead came forth from their tombs. The candle suddenly reappears; its light is as fair as ever. The noise is hushed, and homage is paid to the Conqueror of death.

Will National Cancer Institute Admit Abortion Link to Breast Cancer?

National Cancer Institute researcher, Louise A. Brinton coauthored a 2009 study which acknowledged that abortion is a "known risk factor" for breast cancer and reported a 40% breast cancer risk increase for women who have had abortions. This is noteworthy since Brinton in 2003 was chief organizer of a panel that reported that it had established that there was no link between abortion and breast cancer (ABC link). The National Cancer Institute seemed to be doing everything possible to deny the extensive research indicating the ABC link.

But in April of 2009, the prestigious Janet Daling group of the Fred Hutchinson Research Center in Seattle published in the journal *Cancer Epidemiology, Biomarkers and Prevention* a study conducted by Jessica Dolle affirming the abortion-breast cancer link, and also indicating an association between oral contraception and a particularly aggressive and treatment-resistant form of cancer known as TNBC, finding a 320% risk increase for breast cancer over those who never used contraception. The fact that Louise Brinton coauthored this study seems to indicate that the NCI official is reevaluating the refusal to acknowledge the link.

This study does not reveal anything new regarding the ABC link since Daling studies of 1994 and 1996 showed that there is an increased risk of between 20%-50% for breast cancer in women having abortions in comparison with women who gave birth to their babies.

Dr. Joel Brind, noted breast cancer researcher who is a professor of endocrinology at Baruch College, NY, and co-

founder of the Breast Cancer Prevention Institute, pointed out that "what was striking was the way in which the finding of a significant ABC link was characterized."

"Specifically, abortion appears in the data table which lists the associations found for 'known and suspected risk factors,'" Brind said. "In the text, the effect of the significant risk factors, including induced abortion, were described as 'consistent with the effects observed in previous studies on younger women. Hence, this paper provides clear support for the existence of the abortion-breast cancer link.'"

Karen Malec, president of the Coalition on Abortion/Breast Cancer, said the study and NCI's involvement have implications for health care reform.

"Obviously, more women will die of breast cancer if the NCI fails in its duty to warn about the risks of oral contraceptives and abortion, and if government funds are used to pay for both as a part of any health care bill," Malec asserted.

A study done in Turkey in 2009 showed a 66% increased risk of breast cancer with women who had abortions. It also reinforced other studies that demonstrate that miscarriage (spontaneous abortion) was associated with a decrease in breast cancer risk, in contrast to the sharp increase in risk from induced abortion. The study was conducted by Dr. Vahit Ozmen and colleagues at the Istanbul Medical Faculty, Istanbul University, and was sponsored by Magee-Women's hospital in Pittsburgh.

RU486 Abortions Not as Safe as Claimed

Planned Parenthood says, "Our monitoring shows that mifepristone medication abortion [RU486] continues to be a safe abortion option."

...But a new study from Finland says that 20% of the women using the abortion pill suffer at least one significant complication. Nearly 4% reported two or more complications or "adverse events."

The study, "Immediate Complications after Medical Compared with Surgical Termination of Pregnancy," appeared in the October 2009 issue of the journal *Obstetrics & Gynecology*. A team of Finnish researchers headed by Maarit Niinimäki of the Oulu University Hospital looked at all abortions, surgical and chemical, performed up to 63 days after gestation in Finland between January 1, 2000 and December 31, 2006.

...Researchers looked at all abortion patient and outpatient visits occurring within 42 days after the abortion... and found that 15.6% of those undergoing "medical" (i.e. chemical) abortions hemorrhaged, 1.7% encountered infection, and 6.7% had incomplete abortions.

...But it should be noted that any latent psychological or physical consequences (such as impaired fertility) might not be manifest at 42 days post-abortion.

...In the U.S., the FDA tried to limit abortions using RU486 to 49 days gestation. But the industry has been openly

performing them up to 63 days gestation and sometimes even later.

...In comparison to surgical abortion, the risk of hemorrhage with RU486 was nearly 8 times higher, while the likelihood of an incomplete abortion was 5 times higher.

It was not that surgical abortion was safe, however. About 5.5% of Finnish women having surgical abortions reported at least one adverse event...As might be expected, physical injury rates from surgical abortion were about 20 times higher than those found with chemical abortions, though not as high as an overall percentage of adverse events (0.6%). Surprising from these figures is that there was a substantial number of surgical abortions that were somehow "incomplete," with a number of women returning for "surgical re-evacuations."

This is a much different picture of abortion than one encounters in the United States, where the safety of abortion, chemical or surgical is regularly touted by the abortion industry and its defenders. Risks are mentioned, sometimes at the bottom of the page in small print...or are said to be "rare," ...but the overall message of safety and convenience shines through.

Though the authors of the Finnish study label both the chemical and surgical methods of abortion "generally safe," it is clear that complications are more common than many might have been led to believe, and that contrary to expectations that the chemical method was safer and easier, the data clearly show that "medical abortion results in an increased incidence of adverse events."
