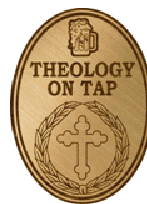

Baptism Prep Classes - meets on Tuesday, March 20th, from 7 - 9 pm in the Birch Library. You need only one godparent and this person must be Catholic; to have celebrated Confirmation; is at least 16 years of age, and is practicing the faith (attending mass each week and celebrating the sacraments.)



For the next two Sundays, the RCIA Elect (those preparing for baptism) will be celebrating the Scrutinies. The scrutiny rites are prayers of exorcism for the unbaptized to help them see sin for what it is, turn away from sin and toward the light of Christ in the waters of Baptism. 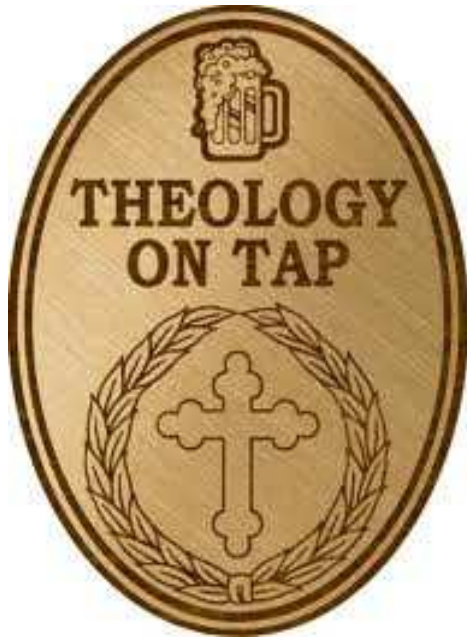
