PARISH NURSE NOTES: Color Blindness - *"Then when they were alone, he turned to the disciples and said, 'Blessed are the eyes that see what you have seen.'" Luke 10:23* Colorblindness, or poor color vision, is where a person has difficulty distinguishing between colors. This can cause confusion at stoplights or if working with color-coded materials. Heredity is the most common cause with 1 in 12 males of Northern European descent experiencing some color difficulty. Other causes include diabetes, glaucoma, Alzheimer's, leukemia, certain medications, exposure to chemicals, and even aging. If you notice a problem with identifying colors, diagnosing is easy. If inherited there is no treatment but if related to illness or medication, the loss of color vision might be slowed or halted. Seeing a professional is important to get the proper diagnosis and prognosis.
