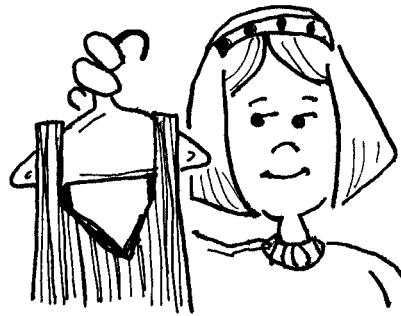
will. The three persons share

Clothing guidelines for Catholic kids

Fit right. If your child loves something that you think is too tight look for the next size or ask if the store offers alterations.



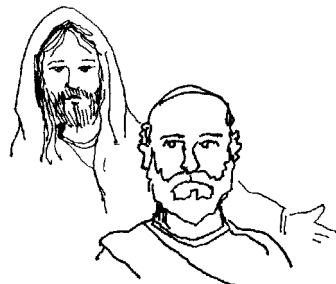
Luke 19:1-10. Zacchaeus makes a special friend.

Zacchaeus was not a popular man. As the chief tax collector in Jericho he probably took more than his share and became wealthy amidst other people's misery.

Imagine the crowd's reaction when Jesus spotted Zacchaeus in a tree and invited himself to dinner at Zacchaeus' home. People were stunned that he would choose to associate with someone they excluded.

Zacchaeus shot down from the tree and fell all over himself to make Jesus welcome.

It didn't bother Jesus that Zacchaeus was unpopular or sinful. He often



befriended the most unlikely people. It turned out Zacchaeus was so eager for Jesus' friendship that he gave up half his wealth as a result and made good amends for past sins.

What can a parent do? Urge your children to ignore gossip and nasty comments made about others. If they have questions about the suitability of a friend

tell them to come to you instead. Teach youngsters to respect everyone even those who are excluded by others. Jesus was tolerant and quick to forgive. We need to do the same.

PARISH NURSE NOTES: October is Domestic Abuse Awareness Month. Here is a quote from the American Bishops' statement about domestic abuse. **The Catholic Church teaches that violence against another person in any**

form fails to treat that person as someone worthy of love. Instead, it treats the person as an object to be used. When violence occurs within a sacramental marriage, the abused spouse may question, **How do these violent acts relate to my promise to take my spouse for better or for worse?** The person being assaulted needs to know that acting to end the abuse does not violate the marriage promises. While violence can be directed towards men, it tends to harm women and children more. In 1992 we spoke out against domestic violence. We called on the Christian community to work vigorously against it. Since then, many dioceses, parishes, and organizations have made domestic violence a priority issue. We commend and encourage these efforts. What can we do as a faith community? Be aware and be ready to assist anyone who finds themselves in this situation. **WHEN I CALL FOR HELP** is the Bishop's program to assist us in being a support and helping the abused and abuser. There are note cards with a brief outline in the pamphlet rack in the Narthex. The hotline number for domestic abuse is 301-662-8800.
