
This week's Gospel Reflection: Luke 12:32-48


The King and His Kingdom

Matthew: The King and His Kingdom, a 25- week study, shows how Jesus builds on the foundation laid in the Old Testament to inaugurate the Kingdom of Heaven on earth. Experience how Jesus relived the life and struggles of Israel to become the faithful and victorious King, and see how the promises of the Old Testament are fulfilled in Christ and his Apostles.

During this study, you will:

- See Jesus as the Son of David, the Son of Abraham, the new Moses, the true manna, the new Temple – and learn what this means for us today.
- Learn how Jesus reconstituted the struggling kingdom of Israel around Himself and brought it to a new level in the Kingdom of God, open to all people.





PARISH NURSE NOTES: Boomerang happens! *"Rejoice. Change your ways. Encourage each other. Live in harmony and peace. Then the God of love and peace will be with you."* **2 Corinthians 13:11**

The boomerang generation refers to adult children who move back into their parents' home after time away. This might be from an inability to find a job after college, a loss of a job, a divorce, a temporary relocation for job/military, or economic reasons. The arrangement is an adjustment for everyone but it can be successful with careful planning. Practice good communication to eliminate any surprises. Set boundaries, rules, and limits for expectations and responsibilities so no one feels mistreated. If small children are part of the move, be sure to understand who is responsible for certain needs and finances.
