PARISH NURSE NOTES: Ovarian Cancer - SYMPTOMS . Bloating, Pelvic or abdominal pain, trouble eating or feeling full quickly, or feeling the need to urinate often. Other symptoms can include . Fatigue, upset stomach, heartburn, or back pain. If these symptoms persist daily for more than two weeks contact your physician. **OVARIAN CANCER RISK FACTORS** . Genetic predisposition, personal or family history of breast, ovarian and colon cancer, increasing age, or undesired infertility. **FACTS** . All women are at risk, if symptoms exist they can be vague, but increase overtime, early detection increases survival rate, a Pap Test does not detect ovarian cancer. While the symptoms of ovarian cancer (particularly in the early stages) are often not acute, they only whisper to you, so you need to listen.
