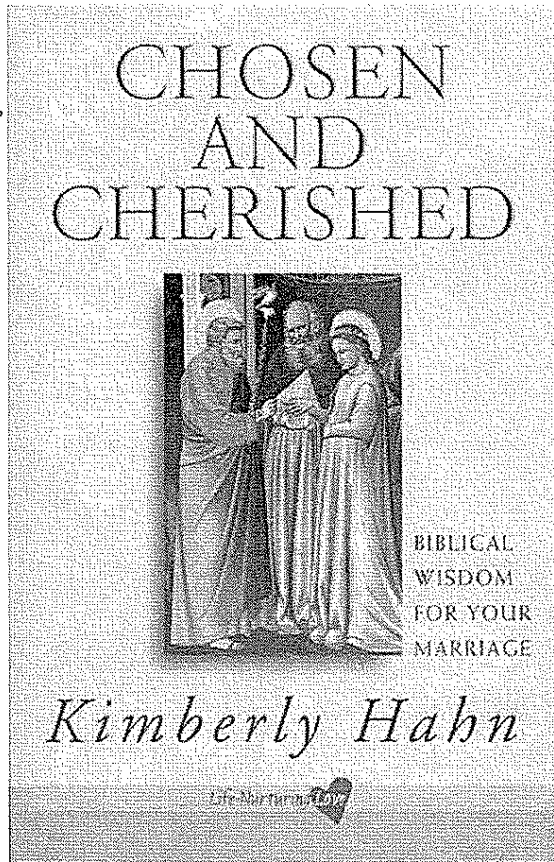

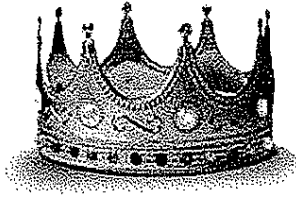

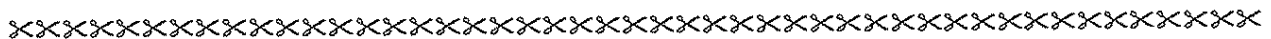
The King and His Kingdom

Matthew: The King and His Kingdom, a 25- week study, shows how Jesus builds on the foundation laid in the Old Testament to inaugurate the Kingdom of Heaven on earth. Remarkable, he received a bruised eye socket but nothing else. WHY? Because he was wearing Rec Specs. These are glasses designed to be worn as safety equipment by anyone participating in sports. They are not only for children who need glasses. Eye injuries in school-age competitors are prevalent because of hand-eye coordination and reaction speed are just developing. 90% of sports related eye injuries can be prevented with use of proper protective eyewear. In the case of the 7 year old, the doctor looked at the damaged lens of the Rec Spec and said that had a direct hit on his eye could have resulted in serious eye damage!
