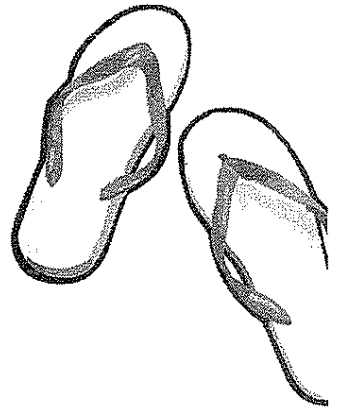
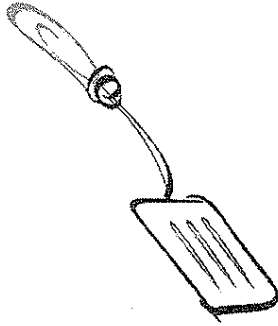
**The Annual Appeal campaign is much different than a one-time special collection. It is a pledge campaign where you can make a gift, payable over ten months.**

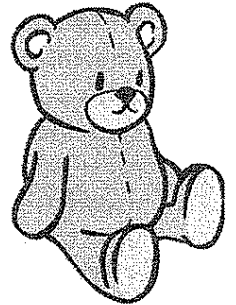

## DONATIONS

We accept clean clothing, shoes, linens, toys, books, house wares, and small appliances such as blenders and radios. We do not have room for large items or furniture. Please no mattresses, TVs, or computers (except laptops). If at all possible please save your summer items until Mar. Our storage space is limited. The shed next to the thrift shop back entrance is always open. Please place items toward the rear. Do not leave items outside.

## History

The idea for a community thrift shop originated in 1974 by Sr. Catherine Burch of St. Peter's (the Burch Library is named after her). A group of women from St. Peter's and the United Methodist Church got together and opened a thrift shop in the Methodist Hall in Dec. 1974. In 1976, Fr. Paul Iaia of St. Peter's arranged for the thrift shop to use the basement of Sappington Hall. It was run by Jo Misulia, followed by Nita Witmer, and for 20 + yrs. by Millie Connor. Millie retired in 2008 and Jean Sherman is the current manager.

The thrift shop operated in the basement at Sappington until the house on Main Street was purchased and renovated by volunteer parishioners supervised by Bill Denning. The thrift shop was closed for 2 years until the new building was ready. It was reopened in July of 2004 to the joy of our loyal customers.

## Present

The thrift shop is staffed by a group of volunteers, some of them serving for 20 + years. There are about 25 ladies who usually work 1 day a week. If you would like to join our group of hard working, fun loving ladies call Jean Sherman at 301-898-7910. Some of our regular customers come from as far away as Thurmont, Hagerstown, Woodbine, Hampstead, and Sykesville. Two customers from Randalstown and Parkville have been coming for 28 yrs. We serve many in the local community also. The proceeds from the Thrift Shop are distributed to local charities. The social concerns committee meets twice a year to determine the beneficiaries of our earnings, which averages about \$700 a week.
