PARISH NURSE NOTES: What do we mean when we speak of domestic abuse? We are speaking about family violence, rape, sexual abuse or child abuse. Domestic violence is a misuse of power and control. It is physical, sexual or emotional abuse. Emotional abuse like name-calling or threatening can be a hurtful and damaging as physical abuse.+ From a Heartley House pamphlet. According to the statement from the U.S. Catholic Bishops, When I Call for Help, Over 50% of the men who abuse their wife, also beat their children. The children in violent homes are more likely to develop drug and alcohol abuse problems and become abusers themselves.+ In fiscal year 2009, Heartley House in Frederick received 22,000 calls to its hotline. That is up from 10,000 in 2004. We need to know how to help our friends, families and neighbors if there is an abusive event. We need to know the signs of abuse in our community so that when your employee or acquaintance shows these signs, you can give the number and information she or he needs to get help before it is too late! Come to the domestic abuse awareness program here at St. Peter's on Sunday evening, March 14th from 7:00pm to 8:30pm. Let's try to break the violent cycle that has been re-occurring in our county!
