1). **CATECHETICAL FAITH FORMATION:** Weekly on Sundays, 10:15 a.m. - 11:15 a.m. (*Just think of all the graces you can accumulate in only one little hour!*) Pre-K, 2nd - 3rd Grade; 4th and 5th Grade. This is a Lectionary-based program (meaning they focus on that Sunday's readings) and come with course outlines and suggested activities. from *Pflaum Publishing*.

2). **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION...FOR KIDS!** Weekly on Sundays, Time TBD 1 hour Children's RCIA (*Just think of the joy you'll have leading children home to Christ!*) This is also a Lectionary-based program and comes with course outlines and suggested activities from *Journey of the Faith*. 3). **SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION:** Eight Evenings Total (four in October, four in March and First Eucharist Services in May) for 1 - 1 1/2 hours. This is a Sacramental Preparation Program from *Pflaum Publishing*.




