PARISH NURSE NOTES: October is National Spina Bifida Awareness Month - What can be done to reduce the risk of a child being born with spina bifida? Studies have shown that if all women who could become pregnant were to take a multivitamin with the B-vitamin folic acid, the risk of neural tube defects could be reduced by up to 70%. Folic acid is a water soluble B-vitamin that helps build healthy cells. Because it is water soluble, folic acid does not stay in the body for very long, so women need to take it every day to help reduce the risk of neural tube defects (NTD). Since half of all pregnancies in the United States are unplanned, women of childbearing age-even if they are not currently planning to get pregnant-should take 400 micrograms (mcg) of folic acid every day to reduce their risk of having a child with Spina Bifida. In addition, women who have experienced a pregnancy affected by a NTD like Spina Bifida need a larger prescription dose of 4000 (mcg) of folic acid daily when planning a pregnancy. Some food sources of folic acid include ready-to-eat cereals can have 100-400 mg per serving, orange juice can have 60-100mg per cup and enriched pasta can have 90+mg per serving. Read the labels and see how easy it is to get your 400 mg. The vitamin is better absorbed through foods than supplements. Be Healthy!
