| Palm Spring Animal Shelter Live Release Rate (LRR): LRR is a meaningful parameter to indicate a community's progress toward improving outcomes for its animals. LRR is calculated by dividing the number of animals that enter PSAS alive less those who die or are euthanized (or are lost), by the total number of live animals received in any given year. PSAS tracks LRR for cats only, dogs only, other animals only, and combined. This is the method previously required for reporting to Best Friends Animal Society and does not include TNR numbers. |                 |   |                              |              |
